The end of the First World War came suddenly.

The Armistice that had brought an end to the fighting was signed in a railway carriage in a forest clearing in Compiègne, France, on 11 November 1918. Six hours later, at 11am, the guns fell silent after four years of fighting.

The diggers had been spared from none of the horrors. Their dead lay strewn across numerous battlefields, and among the survivors were tens of thousands who had been wounded.

The Armistice brought victory to the allied nations, but also sadness. Back home there seemed little to show for the dreadful loss of life, the disruption, and the grief. Yet Australia had changed. Amid the sorrow and suffering was a pride in the nation's achievements and a new confidence about its place in the world.
